Origin

A the border of the Fleurie Appellation, the vines celebrated recently their 60th birthday, symbol of generosity and complexity..

From the vines...

Varietal : 100% Gamay Noir.

Vineyard area : 5 acres.

Density of plantation : 4000 vines per acre.

Vine Age : 60 years old.

Plot : « Les Peloux ».

Soil type : Clay in depth and sand on top.

Elevation : 250m.

Exposure : South east.

Farming : Sustainable farming, short pruning in bushes, putting straw in the vines.

Winemaking : Maceration for 6 days with whole clusters in gridded vats.

Aging : Aged for 6 months in concrete vats.

Clarification : Light filtration.

... To the glass

Crimson red robe with purple tints. The nose is very fruity with blackcurrant notes. In the palate, the wine is very fruity, supple with a bright and mineral finish!

Food pairings

Good with country pate, cured meats, cheese, pasta, mexican and/or asian dishes.
